Headcount and FTE's Fall, 2002 to Fall, 2006 – College Wide

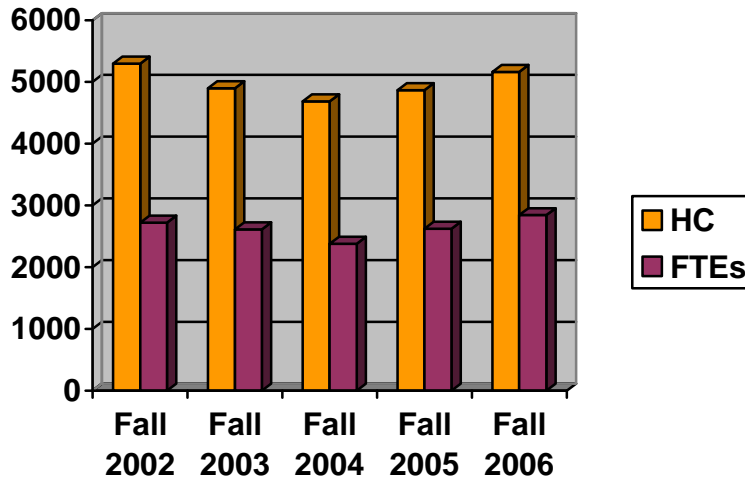

Headcount and FTE's Fall, 2002 to Fall, 2006 – Christanna Campus

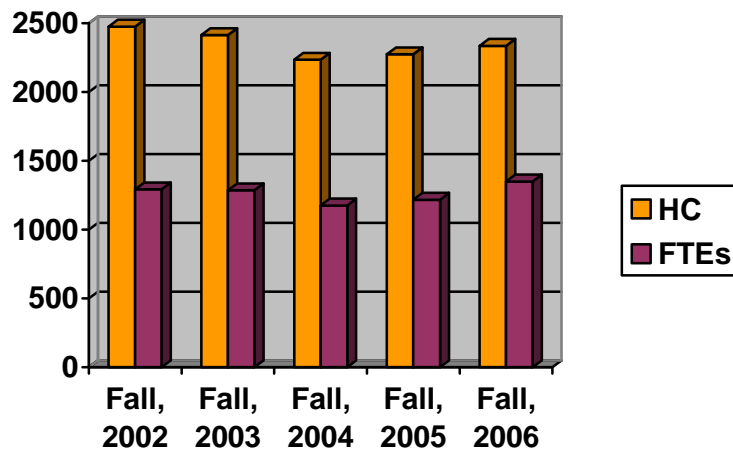

The jurisdictions closest to Christanna Campus are Brunswick, Emporia and Greenville. All three jurisdictions showed a decrease in enrollment from Fall, 2002 to Fall, 2006. Emporia had a 27.4% decrease, Brunswick had a 24.2% decrease and Greenville had a 17.0% decrease. Jurisdictions that are shared with both Christanna and Daniel Campuses are Lunenburg, Mecklenburg and Nottoway. Both Mecklenburg (8.9%) and Nottoway (28%) showed an increase in enrollment from Fall, 2002 to Fall, 2006. Lunenburg remained the same.

Headcount and FTE's Fall, 2002 to Fall, 2006 – John H. Daniel Campus**

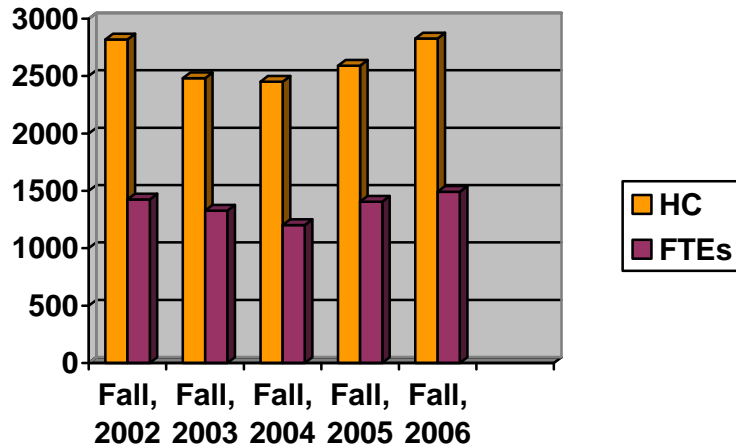

The jurisdictions closest to Daniel Campus are Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Halifax and Prince Edward. Four of the jurisdictions showed an increase in enrollment and one jurisdiction showed a decrease from Fall, 2002 to Fall, 2006. Buckingham had a 17.4% increase, Cumberland had a 90.7% increase, Halifax had a 3.3% increase and Prince Edward had a 9.7% increase. Charlotte jurisdiction showed a decrease of 31.4%.
