STUDENT ENROLLMENT – College Wide

The enrollment information in this study is based on Fall terms only. The years range from 2004 to 2008. Categories include Headcount/FTE, Full-time/Part-time, Gender, Race, Age, Jurisdiction and Plan/Award Types.

Table 1 – Headcount and FTE Distribution

FTE's increased 29.6% and Headcount increased 19.6% between Fall, 2004 and Fall, 2008. As seen in Table 1, Fall 2008 had the largest Headcount and FTE's during the five-year span.

Headcount and FTE's Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008 – College Wide

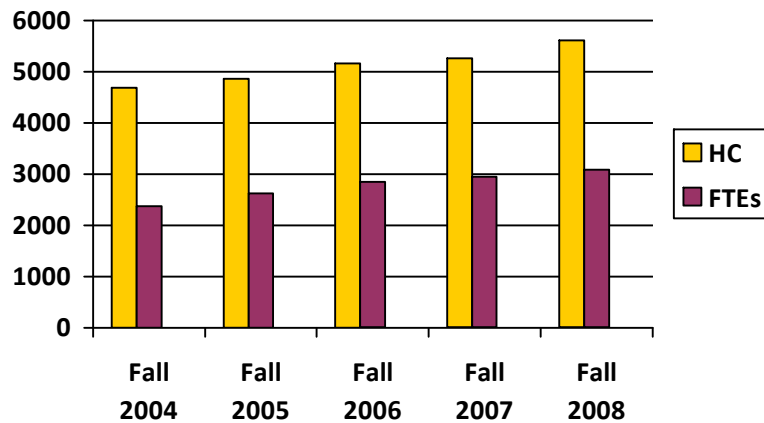

Headcount and FTE’s Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008 – Christanna Campus

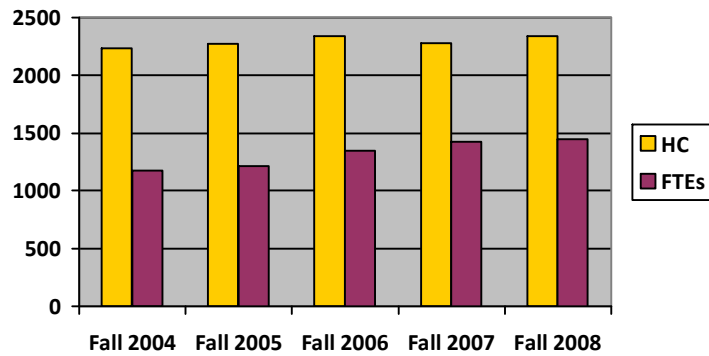

The jurisdictions closest to Christanna Campus are Brunswick, Emporia and Greensville. Brunswick showed a decrease in enrollment (14%) from Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008. Both Emporia (43%) and Greensville (6%) jurisdictions had an increase in enrollment. Jurisdictions that are shared with both Christanna and Daniel Campuses are Lunenburg, Mecklenburg and Nottoway. Lunenburg enrollment increased by 14%, Nottoway enrollment decreased by 13% and Mecklenburg enrollment decreased 3%.

For the five-year period Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008, enrollment in A.S. plans increased 23%. Enrollment in AAS plans was the lowest in Fall, 2008 over the five-year span with a decrease of 32%. Enrollment in the Diploma plans declined 23% from Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008. Certificate plan enrollment was highest in Fall, 2008 over the five-year span with an increase of 20%. The same is true for the Continuing Career Mini Certificate plans with an increase of 50%.

Headcount and FTE’s Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008 – John H. Daniel Campus**

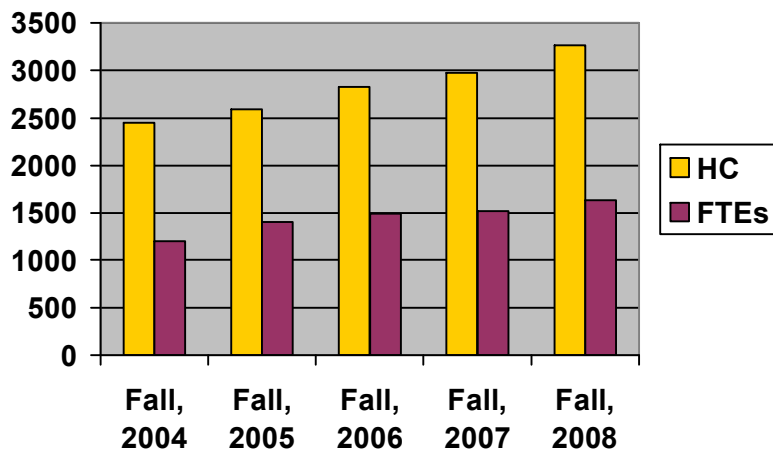

Lunenburg showed an increase of 11% and Nottoway showed an increase of 14% from Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008. Mecklenburg decreased by 13%.

Enrollment in AAS plans was the lowest in Fall, 2008 over the five-year span with a decrease of 25%. Enrollment in the Diploma plans increased 73% from Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008. Certificate enrollment was the highest in Fall, 2008 increasing 78% over the five-year period. The Continuing Career Mini Certificate plans decreased 18% from Fall, 2004 to Fall, 2008.
