Table 1 – Headcount and FTE Distribution

FTE's increased 12.7% and Headcount increased 7.4% between Fall, 2003 and Fall, 2007. As seen the Table 1, Fall 2007 had the largest Headcount and FTE's during the five-year span.

Headcount and FTE's Fall, 2003 to Fall, 2007 – College Wide

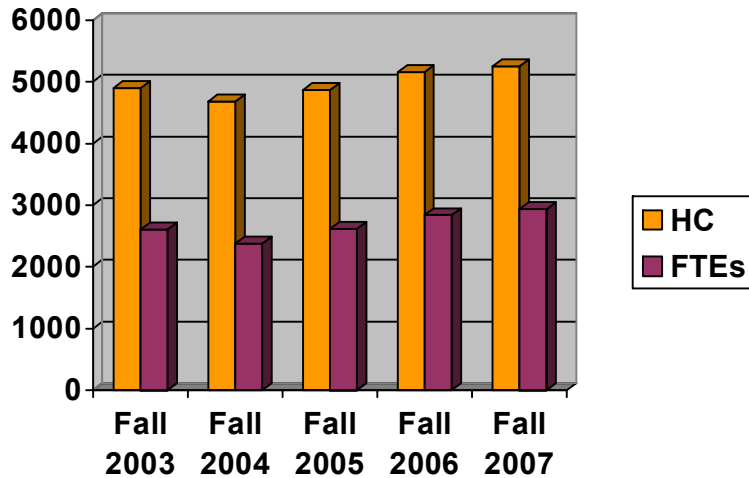

Headcount and FTE's Fall, 2003 to Fall, 2007 – Christanna Campus

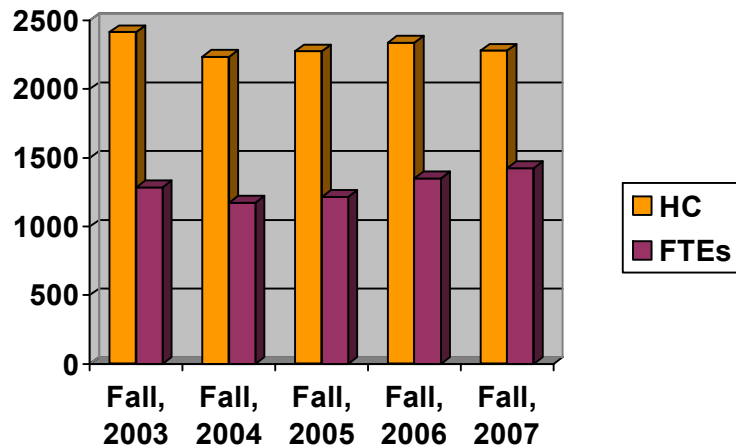

The jurisdictions closest to Christanna Campus are Brunswick, Emporia and Greensville. Brunswick showed a decrease in enrollment (9%) from Fall, 2003 to Fall, 2007. Both Emporia (16%) and Greensville (7.7%) jurisdictions had an increase in enrollment. Jurisdictions that are shared with both Christanna and Daniel Campuses are Lunenburg, Mecklenburg and Nottoway. All three jurisdictions showed a decrease in enrollment from Fall, 2003 to Fall, 2007. Mecklenburg decreased by 16.5%, Nottoway by 5.6% and Lunenburg by 18.6%.

Headcount and FTE's Fall, 2003 to Fall, 2007 – John H. Daniel Campus**

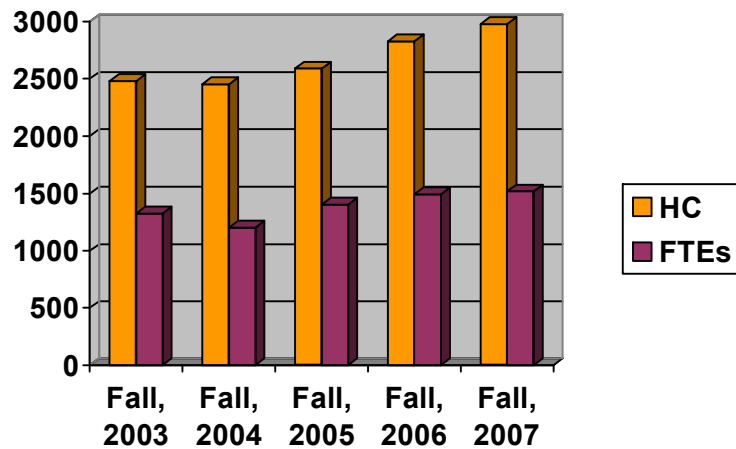
